What is the Fund?

The Michael J. Grant Campus Student Hardship Fund was established with a generous gift from Marc Fellenz, Ph.D., a veteran professor of philosophy in the Grant Campus Department of English and Humanities, in loving memory of his parents, Alfreda and Richard Fellenz. The Fund provides critical support to students attending the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College in Brentwood, New York, who are facing financial hardship that threatens their continued enrollment. The Fund is fully-endowed, meaning the initial gift is invested and interest income will provide grants in perpetuity at Suffolk County Community College.

Am I Eligible?

Support from the Fund is limited to continuing students, either full-time or part-time, who are enrolled at the Michael J. Grant Campus of Suffolk County Community College, who have come upon an unforeseen financial difficulty that jeopardizes their ability to remain enrolled at the College. Recognized hardships include homelessness or pending eviction/foreclosure; loss of utility services; lack of food security; lack of transportation; etc.

Together with the completion of this form, applicants must provide a narrative (limited to 250 words) and supporting documents (invoices, bills, past due rent notices, eviction notices, foreclosure forms, letters and photographs) demonstrating a critical financial need and expressing a desire to continue at Suffolk County Community College.

What is the Grant Amount?

The Michael J. Grant Campus Student Hardship Fund provides a maximum award of up to \$500 per student per year.
